2013-2014 Fact Sheet

SFY 2013 Program Highlights

- Collected a record \$657.2 million in total child support, \$100,000 more than collected in any previous year
- \$41.7 million in TANF collections
- 28,188 new child support orders
- 31,764 paternitys established
- Collected \$26.6 million through driver's license suspensions
- Collected \$46.1 million in child support from intercepted tax refunds
- Collected \$7 million from New Hire Matches
- Collected an estimated \$561 million from Wage Withholding
- Collected \$277,192 from the Passport Denial Program
- Collected over \$14 million in lump sum child support payments and obtained new court orders totaling \$1.3 million from court action

Operations

- Ranked 10th in the nation for cost effectiveness: collected \$7.02 in child support for every dollar spent FFY12
- Caseload of 347,472 cases
- Cases include 327,000 children
- 91% of payments made through wage withholdings
- 93% of payments disbursed electronically
- Involved in 142,730 court hearings involving child support matters



Customer Service

- Prompt response by Customer Service representatives to 99% of calls, almost 90% within 60 seconds
- Call Center answered 4,645,478 calls in SFY13
- Interactive Voice Response System operates 24 hours per day, 7 days per week and answers 100% of incoming calls in English and Spanish

Ongoing Positive Projects

- Access and Visitation Grant: Federal grant used to facilitate parenting agreements; 13,933 parents were served by the program in FFY13

Paternity

Paternity Establishment Program (PEP)

- Enhanced collaboration with paternity vendor and 58 birthing hospitals, which recorded 24,860 paternitys
- Established 34,020 total paternitys, a rate of 94.2 percent, during FFY13
- Collaborated once again with Family Services to include adoptions in federal fiscal year paternity court

Helping Parents

Intensive Case Monitoring Program (ICMP)

- Court-based and administrative ICMP programs are now operating in 34 locations
- Court-based ICMP has collected over \$7.6 million in child support from 2,185 parents since its inception

Prisoner Reentry Initiatives

- Presentations to inmates participating in pre-release programs and resource fairs at state prisons, regional and local jails, and DJJ facilities
- Designated case managers actively identify and contact potential reentry candidates recently released or scheduled for near term release
- Close working relationships with community partners and other state and federal agencies that provide services to reentering citizens
- Active participation in local Reentry Councils
- Family Strong Prisoner Reentry Pilot Project starting November 2013
